Competitions Played Through 2022

- I would like to say thankyou to all members who have participated in the competitions over the season, the majority of them have been well supported with numbers up on the previous year.
- There has been a change to entering into major competitions. To play in a major or matchplay competition you will now have to of played in at least 4 medal or stapleford competitions or a combination of both in the last 12 months.
- May I remind all members once they have signed up to a competition they
 are agreeing to the rules of that competition, and any member signing up
 to play in a major competition and fails to turn up to play will be
 suspended from the next three club competitions (depending on the
 reason). And the entrance fee deducted.

Key changes to the Rules of Golf for 2023.

- No penalties for failing to put handicaps on the scorecard.
- As it stands, failing to put your handicap on your scorecard would mean disqualification, regardless of how you performed, but an amendment to Rule 3.3b (4) for 2023 means this will no longer be a requirement.
- The R&A and USGA have decided that with the continued growth of score-posting technology following the adoption of the World Handicap System that the competition committee will be responsible for ensuring the accuracy of each player's handicap and calculating it.
- Clubs could use a new Model Local Rule, to put the responsibility back on the player.

THE COMMITTEE WILL BE PUTTING IN PLACE A MODEL LOCAL RULE STATING IT IS STILL THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PLAYER TO PUT THEIR HANDIPCAP INDEX AND PLAYING HANDICAP FOR ALL COMPETITIONS ON HIS/HER SCORECARD.

- You can replace a club if it gets damaged during your round.
- Don't immediately think you can start snapping clubs over your knee or wrapping them around a tree after every bad shot. This change to Rule 4.1a (2) allows players to replace a club that is damaged during a round as long as that damage has not been caused by abuse.
- If the clubhead flies off when you hit a drive, your iron bends because you didn't spot a tree root, or you take a lump out of the face of a wedge when you catch a stone then you can replace that club.
- Unfortunately, unlike the Tour pros, it will be of limited benefit to those of us who don't have Tour trucks on site!
- You can replace a ball moved by natural forces.
- For 2023, any ball that is caused to move to another area of the course after being dropped, placed, or replaced, must be replaced without penalty. This is also the case if the ball comes to rest out of bounds.
- Back-on-the-line relief made simpler.
- The procedure for taking penalty area or unplayable ball relief will be simpler from 2023, meaning that when players drop the ball on their line it must come to rest within one club length of where it was dropped. And, before you ask, the club length can be in any direction, INCLUDING FORWARDS.

- You can't stand behind your partner to gain information about your side's next stroke.
- If, once you begin taking a stance for a stroke, your partner is stood in a location "on or close to an extension of the line of play behind the ball", you are in breach of Rule 10.2b (4).
- Now, in addition, Rule 22.6 in foursomes and Rule 23.8 in fourballs bans a player from doing this while their partner is making a stroke to "gain information for their next stroke".

Failing to submit a score will see you get a "penalty score"

- When the WHS came into effect in England it gave players the opportunity to submit scores outside of competitions, known as general play.
- It is the responsibility of golfers to make sure they pre-register and then submit their scores, but in their notes to clubs England Golf has revealed "this isn't always the case".
- This can leave an unsatisfied score intent in a player's record. The Handicap chiefs have introduced an automated feature around the submission of general play scores either through the My England Golf App or the club software systems. Where players fail to submit a scores following automated reminder emails a penalty score will be automatically applied.
- Clubs now have the ability to run reports on which players have received automatic penalty scores which will allow us to adjust or remove the score if needed.
- It will also be able to identify players who pre-registered a round in the My England Golf App but then delete it.
- As part of this process, they are asked to provide a reason for deleting the score it will be down to the handicap committee to review the delete score intent report, and review the reasons, if not a valid reason a penalty score can be applied.
- The recommended penalty is "course rating + course handicap".
- What this means is that once the players pre-register an intent to score they are completely responsible for ensuring it is submitted.
- The onus will also be on golfers to justify deleting a score and committees will then decide whether they accept that or apply a penalty score.

- The Bowker Cup will be reintroduced this year as an eclectic.
- 5 major competitions will be used throughout 2023.





Q8. How would you rate your membership experience



Q9. When considering joining a golf club, which of the following would you prioritise (PLEASE SELECT 4 ONLY):













Q26. Upon arrival, do staff greet you personally and appropriately?:



Q27. Are staff dressed properly in uniform attire?



Q28. On a scale of 1–5 how would you rate the atmosphere/friendliness of the dining/members area



Q29. How would you rate the cleanliness of the dining area?







Q30. How would you rate the variety of food and drink on offer, quality of product and timely service?



- A lot of members are still on old rates as they have never been brought forward to updated fees. This is due to rolling contracts continuing in the background, which have never caught up.
- Easier to manage less chance for members to "slip through the net". Most of the work Carmel/Julie do is chase people up for fees, sign up new members, cancel old members at different points of the year. This is potentially why the systems have been difficult to monitor and "HUMAN" may have occurred.
- Runs inline with the golf season, allowing a welcome pack at the start of each year (fixture diary, bag tags etc). Age renewals groups are once a year. Every club in the area runs their membership this way.
- Busier March, April and May renewal period allows 9/10 months to focus on additional streams of revenue. Hole sponsorship & Corporate deals. I can prioritise sponsorship in Nov/Dec each year in preparation for the following season.
- Easier to manage locker inventory, as everyone's locker renewals are payable at the same time.
- Allows a budget to be forecast each year assisting with course development. Renewal revenue (and most new members) will be in April in line with tax year.
