Senior Captains Report – AGM 2025: Steven Thornton

We currently have a membership of around 60 senior players with an average of 46 players taking part in our Thursday competitions, as well as playing fixtures against other local Golf Clubs at Senior Level.

Over the year we have seen 71 players play 1738 rounds of golf on a Thursday.

Additionally, this year we played 16 matches, winning 9, Drawing 3 and Losing 4. We managed this whilst being as inclusive as possible, promoting members of all abilities to participate, enjoying playing different formats, visiting other clubs and fostering new friendships along the way.

A great deal of thanks to all who participated as well as the support from the club and Catering staff who make the home games very enjoyable for everyone.

I held my Captains away day on the 19th of June at Handsworth Golf Club. We had 46 seniors attending along with the Club Captain Paul as our guest. A great golfing day and a very nice meal to end the day.

Next year, Ian has put together a schedule which will include some new additional clubs to continue progressing the Seniors section. We are working on

pulling together a calendar of events for 2026 which will include all the formats used last year as well as Captain v President and hopefully Captain v Vice Captain competitions.

To enable us to obtain a favorable deal for everyone we have gone ahead and secured a deal for next year's Captains Away Day. We will be going to Aston Wood Golf Club on 30th July.

There has been some great work out on the course by Wayne and his team which has improved playing conditions greatly over the last few months, gaining praise not only from our seniors but also visiting teams.

We have taken on board the introduction of mats during the winter period to help protect the course and have encouraged members to use them in our competitions as well as general play.

Competitions Played

The total number of club competitions played in 2025 were 56

They were made up of

30 Stableford / Stroke Play

21 Majors
Excluding the 5 match play knockouts



There were 140 members who entered the Club Competitions in 2025 recording 1411 Scores.



Again 82 members who recorded 682 general play scores at Calderfields



Which gives a grand total of 2093 recorded scores



We also had 96 penalty scores recorded

The WHS allows all committees to access and run several reports.

These consist of:

Competition v's General Play score.

9-hole v's 18-hole scores.

General play scores.

Deleted score intents.

Penalty scores by player.

Penalty scores submitted.

And a few more.

Some of these I have used in this evening's presentation

Here are some examples:

- Penalty scores submitted = 96
- Deleted score intent= 97 (these will now be monitored and acted on if the same member is seen to be deleting intent scores regularly).
- General play scores = 682

Another report that we check often is the Competition V's General Play scores

Competition Vs General Play Score Report

Runs comparisons between General Play score submissions and Competition Scores.

Ideally for looking at the differences in the performance levels of players, across General Play and Competition Golf. Any significant difference between the 2 round types may be an indication of manipulation.

Comparisons Between 9 and 18-hole rounds (9-hole vs 18-Hole Scores)

Provides detail of players performance over both 9 and 18 holes. WHS recommend that if any members scores are 4 strokes higher in general play scores to competition scores, then we need to monitor that member.

So, with that in mind and with the scores that have been recorded in 2025.

The committee has decided to hold two Handicap Reviews a year; one midyear and one at the end of year from this year (2026).

I have run a hole stat's report, and as you can see based on 3741 rounds recorded rounds, recorded between 1st January and 31st December 2025 .

The present stroke indexes are very close to what we have. The course will be remeasured by England Golf sometime this year and the Stroke index's will be reviewed then.

Team Captain Rob Ash Field.


It has been another excellent year for the team. We retained the Woodward Cup and, after too many seasons as runners-up, finally won the Division 1 League.

Head Greenkeepers Report for the 2025 AGM

Firstly, thank you to the directors for their ongoing investment in the golf course. Also, a thank you to the committee and members for their support since my appointment in June last year.

Prior to my appointment I inherited greens heavily diseased with fusarium and scarring because of this. To get the greens back to an acceptable standard we.

1. Changed the seed to a Fescue Bent from a Dwarf Rye
2. Regular Verti cutting
3. Sprayed with a fungicide to kill any live disease
4. Fertilized the greens with a 12o12 summer feed
5. Watering the greens as much as possible

In September we tined, dimpled and Verti cut the greens and overseeded with a fescue bent seed and top dressed.

The following week we fertilized with a 442-renovation feed & in November a winter feed (a 5510) went on the greens.

Once the weather improves and the course dries out then we will fertilize with another winter feed.

2025 was one of the hottest and driest summers on record. With temperatures regularly getting above 30 degrees the daily jobs were to get as much water on the greens as possible.

One of my main objectives was to get the irrigation working on the 9th, 17th & 18th greens, which we have now done. This will save time meaning we can get more water onto the greens each morning and evening.

This week we have hired a stump grinder, and I would like to thank the directors for their support by agreeing to hire this.

We are getting as many stumps as possible from the course, meaning it will look tidier and be easier to cut.

I would like to thank the members for keeping their trolleys off the fairways during winter and to those who are using fairway mats. Every little help makes our job a lot easier.

Finally, our aim for 2026 is to build on what we have achieved and get the course set up for a good season ahead.



2. Repair pitch marks with a pitchfork. Please find yours, repair it and one other. If everyone repairs 2 pitch marks on each green, then the greens will benefit.
3. No starting on the 10th tee unless the shop clear it for you.

PACE OF PLAY

Ready Golf. (FOR STROKE PLAY)



Hit your Shot

Hit your shot if the player who has just played from a bunker is still farther away but delayed due to raking the bunker.



Putt Out

Putt out even if it means standing close to someone else's line.



Honour

Hit your tee shot if the player with the honour is not ready to play.



Shorter Hitters First

If the group in front is out of range, short hitters play first.



Hit then Search

Hit your shot before helping someone search for their ball.



Assessment

Play when a player who is farther away is facing a challenging shot and is taking time to assess their options.



Over the Back

When a player's ball has gone over the back of the green, play if you are ready.



PACE OF PLAY

Player Behaviour.



Pre-Shot Routines



Keep your routine short and avoid lots of unnecessary practice swings.

Tees



You should play from tee positions that reflect your ability.

Be Ready



Be ready to play when it is your turn.

Provisional Ball



If you think your ball may be lost or out of bounds, play a provisional.

Card Marking



Don't mark your scorecard while others are waiting.

Position of Bags & Carts



Golf bags or carts should be carefully positioned to allow quick movement off the green.

Shot Assessment



Assess your shot in good time and don't delay.

Management Practices.



Longer Starting Intervals



Avoid overcrowding the course – more golfers causes congestion. Longer intervals between starting times can help.

Encourage Ready Golf



Use Ready Golf in stroke play formats.

Encourage shorter and faster forms of play, e.g. 9-hole, match play and Skittleford.

Time Par



Establish a target time for your course and monitor performance.

How to get a handicap

1. You need to play 54 holes of golf, either 3 rounds of 18 or combinations of 9 and 18 hole rounds
2. Have your scorecard marked and signed by another player to witness the round
3. Please refer to the next couple of slides as to how to mark a scorecard correctly
4. Once you have the scorecards then drop these into the box in the shop or give directly to Adrian.
5. Your handicap will be issued within a few days and you can find out what this is by contacting the club

HOW TO MARK A SCORECARD

1. Write the name of the competition, general play, stableforg, medal or card for handicap in the 'competition' box
2. Tick which tees you are playing from (white, yellow or red)
3. Enter the date of play
4. Enter your handicap and the playing handicap for the day. If this is a round to obtain a handicap then leave this blank
5. Write the name of the player in player A and their gross scores in player A's column
6. The marker must write their gross score in the markers score column
7. If it is a handicap card, please only have the members scores for handicap, not all 4 players in the group on the same card
8. The person marking the card must sign it and the player must check their scores and sign the card

As of tomorrow, the front 9 will be yellow & the back 9 reds



The story of 2025 on the course

1. We started the year like many local golf clubs, with fusarium disease in the greens.
2. Unfortunately, Matt Jupp left early in the year and his replacement, Simon only managed a couple of months and left at the end of May
3. Wayne took on the role of head greenkeeper and we promoted Alan from within the team to become Wayne's deputy.
4. I'd like to thank Wayne and the team for the work they have done since his appointment. The greens are in great shape for the winter and next season

So, what has been done to get the course back to the standard it should be?

1. We reintroduced a fescue bent seed back into the greens
2. Reduced the size of the greens to their original size to create better fringes and surrounds.
3. Regular Verti cutting & fertilising
4. Top dressing
5. Water, water and more water. The irrigation has now been fixed on the 9th, 17th & 18th and is now working on all 18 greens, a luxury we have not had for over 15 years. Not only was hand watering these 3 greens time-consuming, but with golfers playing it was almost impossible to get the water on that was needed, especially during the dryest and hottest summer on record

2026 focus

Greens – Continue with the progress that Wayne & the team have made,

Regular Verti cutting, getting more fescue bent seed & sand into them.

Increasing the quality of the playing surfaces therefore increasing the speed.

Keep bunkers free of weeds and strim regularly

Ongoing winter work

Filling in the potholes

on the paths

Stump grinder

Tidying the course of fallen branches/trees

Once they are dry then rotavate the bunkers ready for the season ahead

1. Calderfields Golf and Country Club, £995 per year

Calderfields Golf and Country Club, situated near Walsall, combines a full length eighteen hole parkland course with hotel accommodation, a lakeside setting and a modern clubhouse. The course is designed to test a range of shots, with water in play on several holes and a mixture of tree lined fairways and more open holes that encourage confident driving.

As a member you are not only joining a golf club but also gaining access to a broader country club environment, including a practice area and short game facilities, a popular restaurant and regular social events. For golfers who value both golf and off course amenities, Calderfields represents very good value in the Birmingham area at just under one thousand pounds per year.

Travel from Birmingham city centre is straightforward. The club lies to the north of the city and is typically around a 25 to 30 minute drive, depending on traffic. The route largely follows the main roads towards Walsall, which makes it realistic for both weekend golf and occasional midweek rounds.

I'm writing to ask whether the committee might consider scheduling some additional Stableford competitions on Fridays, alongside the existing weekday and weekend events?

I appreciate that the calendar already includes several weekend Stablefords, which is great to see. However, most of the mid-week Stableford competitions currently fall on Wednesdays and Thursdays, which can make regular participation difficult for some members due to work and other commitments.

Introducing occasional Friday Stablefords, or rotating some of the existing mid-week Stablefords onto different days, could open up more opportunities for members who struggle with the current pattern. A slightly broader spread of competition days might help increase participation, enhance members' enjoyment, and strengthen the sense of community within the club.

I'd be grateful for the committee's thoughts on whether this could be explored in future scheduling.

Thank you for your email and for taking the time to share your thoughts on the Stableford competition schedule.

We appreciate your suggestion regarding the introduction of additional Friday Stablefords and recognise that weekday commitments can make it challenging for some members to participate regularly. When planning the 2025 calendar, the committee aimed to balance a range of playing opportunities across weekdays and weekends. As part of this, the schedule already includes the regular midweek Stablefords of 9 hole and 18-hole competitions, along with the monthly Medal and Stablefords. In addition, we have extended the bank holiday weekend competitions to include either the Friday and Mondays or both.

At present, the committee feels this provides a reasonable spread of competition days within the constraints of course availability, staffing, and the wider competition programme. That said, your feedback is valuable, and we will continue to monitor participation levels and member feedback as the season progresses. Scheduling remains under regular review, and suggestions such as yours help inform future planning.
